THE WORD JACK-O'-LANTERN MAY COME FROM AN IRISH TALE.

In the story, a man named Jack cheats the devil. The devil gives Jack a piece of coal to light his way as he forever walks the earth. Jack became known as Jack of the Lantern—or later, jack-o'-lantern.



In the tale, Jack, or Stingy Jack, wasn't allowed to enter heaven or hell after he died. He had to walk the earth forever.

This is a copy of a turnip jack-o'-lantern from the early 1900s. It's in the National Museum of Ireland—Country Life in Furlough, Ireland.

In the jack-o'-lantern story, Jack cut into a turnip to hold his burning coal. In time, people in Ireland, England, and Scotland carved faces into turnips. They used them to scare off evil spirits.

1 Fold the card stock in half. Have an adult help you use the compass, pencil, and ruler to draw a circle 2 inches (5 cm) across, and one that is 6 inches (15 cm) across around it.

2 Cut around the pencil line, through both layers of card stock. Cut out the inner circles. Make a paper bobbin out of scrap card stock. Wrap gray yarn around it, making sure it can fit through the small paper holes.

3 Place one card stock circle on top of the other and start wrapping the yarn around them. Make three complete layers of wrapped yarn.

4 Ask an adult to help you slide the scissors between the card stock circles to cut the yarn. Wind a length of yarn between both card stock circles, pull it tight, and tie a knot. Remove the card stock.

5 Cut out ears, a nose, front and back paws, and a tail from the felt. Stick them to the pom-pom with fabric glue. Glue on the googly eyes.

Ghosts



The idea of haunting spirits exists in most cultures. These 'ghosts' usually have similar origins: after someone dies, their spirit, with their memories from life, still lingers on. The descriptions of the ghosts themselves vary. Sometimes they're described as a semitransparent being, able to pass through walls. Some are said to be visible to humans, and some are invisible but can be felt, making those nearby feel cold.


GHOSTS VS. SCIENCE

The ideas we have about ghosts raise a lot of questions about the scientific and practical likelihood of their existence. So let's consider what being a ghost would really be like.

THE UNTOUCHABLES

When ghosts are shown in movies and described in books, one of the hardest things to understand is how they move around. Often, they are portrayed as intangible beings (meaning they cannot be touched). Other characters are able to walk straight through the ghosts as if they are wisps of light, instead of tangible (touchable) objects. On the other hand, those same ghosts are often described as walking on roads, climbing stairs, getting into elevators, or even driving cars.

How does that make sense? If your body cannot interact with your surroundings, then shouldn't that rule apply to every part of you, even your bum when sitting, or the soles of your feet on the pavement?



GOING NOWHERE

If you can pass through walls and people, then you can't stand on the floor. You would have to be floating all the time, because the act of walking requires interaction with the ground. Every step you take consists of your foot pushing down and back against the floor, propelling you up and forwards. Even moving through the air requires interaction with the air molecules, so intangible ghosts would be stuck in one place!

Filmmakers: pick a story and stick with it!

FREEZING WATER

Ice makes rock crack and crumble.

Rain and melting snow can soak into cracks in rock. If the weather gets very cold, that water freezes into ice. This makes it grow in size. This puts pressure on the rock, which can split and break.

How do hoodoos form?
Hoodoos are tall, thin spires of rock. Many hoodoos are made by water freezing and melting, over and over again.

Step 1
A flat-topped block of rock, called a butte, is left standing after the surrounding rock has worn away. The butte is topped with hard rock, which protects the softer rock beneath.

Step 2
Water seeps into joints in the rock's surface. When it freezes, making many vertical cracks. This cracked structure is called a fin.

Step 3
As the temperature falls and rises, the freezing and melting continues. The cracks grow wider, forming hoodoos.

How are arches made?
Arches of rock are also made by ice. Water seeps into a crack in the middle of a butte, then freezes and melts again and again. As the rock crumbles, the wind blows it away.

Delicate Arch, in Utah, is 50.5 feet (15 m) tall.

EARTHQUAKES IN HAITI

Haiti has faced powerful earthquakes for centuries. This is because the country sits between two fault zones, or groups of faults. There's one zone in the north and one in the south.

On January 12, 2010, the deadliest earthquake in Haiti's history struck near the country's capital, Port-au-Prince. With a magnitude of 7.0, the earthquake caused a lot of damage. More than 1 million people lost their homes. Haiti's government reported that 220,000 to 316,000 people died, making this the deadliest earthquake in modern history. Because the damage was so severe, it was hard to know exactly how many people were affected.

THE 2021 QUAKE

ON AUGUST 14, 2021, AN EARTHQUAKE WITH AN EVEN LARGER MAGNITUDE HIT HAITI. THIS 7.2-MAGNITUDE EARTHQUAKE DAMAGED ABOUT 18,000 HOMES, AND 2,200 PEOPLE DIED. EVEN THOUGH IT WAS A BIGGER EARTHQUAKE, THERE WAS NOT AS MUCH DAMAGE AS THERE WAS IN 2010. THIS MAY BE BECAUSE THE EARTHQUAKE HAPPENED FARTHER AWAY FROM WHERE PEOPLE LIVED.

What's really weird is that the germ changes how mice behave – a bit like the zombie ant fungus on page 15. It makes mice less scared of cats so it's easier for cats to catch them! So for cats, toxo can be a good thing. For mice, not so much!

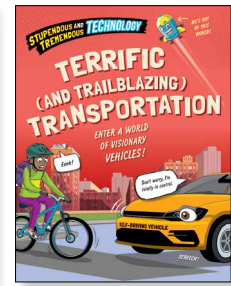
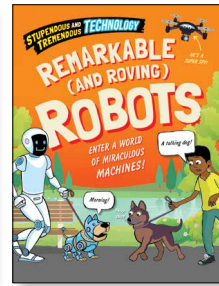
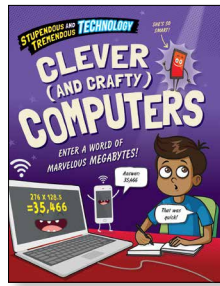

ALMOST HUMAN

Cybernetics is the name of a complicated branch of science. It's the study of how systems use control and communication to function. By systems, we mean anything from a colony of ants to your local community! But cybernetics is also applied to machines.

WHAT ARE CYBERNETIC HUMANS?

In simple terms cybernetic humans are humanoid robots. Some of them have a human shape – two legs, two arms, and so on – but otherwise look like a more traditional robot (think C3PO from *Star Wars*). But other humanoid robots are so lifelike that you'd need to look twice to check they weren't real! These cybernetic humans have "skin" that looks and feels very realistic. Their eyes move and blink. And they may have a wide range of facial expressions, almost as if they are feeling different emotions.

ARE ROBOTS GOOD AT ART?

Cybernetics is all about information – getting it and using it. To be truly "human-like," robots need to learn and educate themselves. But there's a whole lot more to being human than just knowing things. We also have creativity and imagination – we can conjure ideas from our complex minds and turn them into stories, paintings, or songs. Robots seem well adapted for practical subjects, such as math and physics, but is it possible to give them spontaneous creative ideas that will bring them one step closer to being human?


DO CYBORGS REALLY EXIST?

Cyborgs do exist – but not in quite the form you might imagine from sci-fi films! "Cyborg" refers to cybernetics and organic material – that is, a mix of a machine and a living organism. One of the most amazing things that robotics has achieved is creating bionic limbs. These artificial arms and legs respond like real limbs do to messages from the human brain. Perhaps one day it will even be possible to implant robot brains in human bodies – or vice versa.
