We turned again. The harbor disappeared behind more maples.


"We're staying near the old mines," Mom told us. "They dug for silver and lead around here. Right up until the 1910s."

Of course, it's Zoe coming back for more.





- Watched our classmates


(Plus Mark Peterson's date, who doesn't go to our school, and who hung around alone.)

The theme of the contest is teamwork, he says.


All entries must have two authors.

Forced to watch out the big windows.


Forced to look out at a whole lot of nothing.


